

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CREATION

Passage Reading Genesis 2:18-24



LESSON CONCEPT:

God sanctifies marriage.

LESSON SUMMARY:

- Adam lives in the garden of Eden.
- Adam is alone.
- Adam needs a helper comparable to him.
- God creates Eve, and Adam is happy.
- God establishes this principle of marriage: "A man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and they shall become one flesh"
- Adam and Eve were naked but not ashamed. Our body is not the cause of shame; the sin is!

- Males and females: do we notice it in other living beings? (Dogs, Horses, Birds..)
- What is the Sacrament of Matrimony?
- Marriage was established between man and woman, do other relationships qualify to be called "Marriage"?
- Do we hate gays and lesbians? (God is Love, and we love everyone)
- Can I love / accept someone and in the same time reject / disagree with some of their actions?



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CREATION

Passage Reading Genesis 2:18-24

LIFE APPLICATION:

- Is it easy to accept others? The same gender or different gender?
- Why does it have to be a male and a female that are married?
- Does God hate gays and lesbians?
- How should we interact with them?

CHURCH CONCEPT:

- God created male and female. Marriage is more than a civil contract; it is a lifelong covenant of love between a man and a woman.
- A man should leave his father and mother and be ioined to his wife.
- Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ loved the Church. (Ephesians)

Bible Verse

And the Lord God said, "It is not good that man should be alone; I will make him a helper comparable to him." (Genesis 2:18)

ACCEPTED OFFERING

Passage Reading Genesis 4:2-7



LESSON CONCEPT:

Obeying the commandment proves my love to God.

LESSON SUMMARY:

- Cain gave his offering without love, and he wasn't humble.
- Instead of being ashamed of himself, Cain was angry and jealous that God accepted Abel's offering and not his.
- (Ver. 6 & 7): God did not leave Cain but rather talked to him to bring him to a good temper and gave him another chance to repent.
- The difference between the 2 offerings:
- Abel offered his sacrifice obeying God's commandment, he offered his best lamb: not a lame lamb.
- Cain offered his sacrifice as a tradition, not because of his faith; he just copied those around him making a sacrifice.
- Abel made God his priority, so he did not keep the best to himself and offered it to God.
- The sacrifice of blood was for the remission of sins in the O.T.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

- If your parents gifted your sibling and not you, would you be iealous?
- When we pray, fast, read the Bible or give alms, do we do it out of love or because we must?
- Keeping God as the priority in our day/life, by giving some time of my day to pray & read the Bible quietly (quiet time).
- God is tender., even when we sin, we always have another chance through repentance.



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ACCEPTED OFFERING

Passage Reading Genesis 4:2-7

LIFE APPLICATION:


- What should I donate: old or new clothing?
- If I don't have money, can I give God time only?
- Does God forgive me if I'm jealous of someone?
- What should I do when I fall (sin)?

CHURCH CONCEPT:

- Whatever we give to the poor and the needy we give to God "He who has pity on the poor lends to the Lord".
- We should give cheerfully "God loves a cheerful giver".
- God accepts our offerings if we give with love.
- God always gives us a chance to repent and confess if we sin.
- God gives us warnings as He did with Cain.
- love and trust. He/She can also spiritually guide me.

Bible Verse

If you love Me, keep My commandments (John 14:15)



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END OF FLOOD

Passage Reading Genesis 8



LESSON CONCEPT:

Because I am the son of the heavenly Father, I trust that He will deliver me of any problem.

LESSON SUMMARY:

- God remembers Noah. Does God forget us?
- The ark rests on Mount Ararat.
- Noah sent birds to test the condition of the earth.
- Noah, his family, and all the animals leave the ark.
- God's covenant with Noah.
- God's promise to Noah and to all mankind.

- Are there any similarities between what happened with Noah and our life during the Pandemic (COVID)?
- Does the ark represent the church? What are the similarities?
- Can I have a church in my house? What is my role in the church of my house?
- Do I have peace and trust in God like Noah?
- Do we thank God after He delivers us from any problem like what Noah did?

LIFE APPLICATION:

- Do we need to go to the church to pray? Or can we pray at home?
- How can we obey God if He asks me to be different?
- Why can't I go with the flow?
- I need to pray when I find myself in a problem. I trust that God will respond.

CHURCH CONCEPT:

- Don't miss the boat (the church).
- Remember we are all at the same boat. Plan ahead. It wasn't raining when Noah started to build the ark.
- There is no salvation out of the church.
- We need the church to be saved, as Noah and his family needed the ark to be saved.

Bible Verse

They will fight against you, but they shall not prevail against you. For I am with you," says the Lord, "to deliver you." (Jeremiah 1:19)

RE-BLESSING THE CREATION

Passage Reading Genesis 9:1-17

LIFE APPLICATION:

- Do we have to keep our promises?
- Why shouldn't we fear anything?
- Why did God bless Noah and his sons?
- I will make sure this week to show my care and love to my family and my friends.

CHURCH CONCEPT:

- God gave Noah dominion over everything on earth.
- So, we should fear nothing, but we ought to give thanks to Him always.
- The church taught us to pray the thanksgiving prayer on all occasions (it is You who gave us the authority to tread on serpents and scorpions.....)

Bible Verse

Thus I establish My covenant with you: Never again shall all flesh be cut off by the waters of the flood; never again shall there be a flood to destroy the earth." (Genesis 9:11)

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PATRIARGH



A time of godly men presiding over the growing family of God. Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Joseph, successive generations of the same family, ruled over the Hebrew people in the earliest days of their existence.

LESSON 1

Abraham

God's blessing to Abraham (Genesis 22:13-18)

LESSON 2

Isaac

Isaac the man of peace (Genesis 26:24-33)

LESSON 3

Jacob

Jacob the deceitful (Genesis 27)

Joseph

Joseph meets with Pharaoh (Genesis 41:33-57)



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ABRAHAM

Passage Reading Genesis 22:13-18



LESSON CONCEPT:

God bestows blessings on us when we obey His commandments.

LESSON SUMMARY:

** Please don't focus on the request itself "killing his son" (this will be misunderstood by the kids), rather please focus on Abraham's thoughts, "Shall I trust God or not? Shall I trust His promises or not?" **

- God wanted to test Father Abraham (testing him means that God wanted to reveal Father Abraham's full obedience to all generations and set him as a perfect example to everyone).
- Abraham does not postpone his obedience or even slow down, because it is a heavenly commandment, and he must fulfill it in the best way.
- The trip to the mountain.
- "By faith Abraham when he was tested offered up Isaac,... concluding that God was able to raise him up, even from the dead" (Hebrews 11:17-19)

- Do you think this was the first time that Fr. Abraham obeys whole heartedly God's commandment?
- What helped Fr. Abraham obey God in such a tough commandment? (Love, Trust, Faith)
- How can we obey God in this age?



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ABRAHAM

Passage Reading Genesis 22:13-18

LIFE APPLICATION:

- Do we have to obey?
- How can we trust God from all our hearts?
- When we obey God, what blessings can we receive from Him, as He had blessed Abraham earlier?
- If I find myself in a difficult situation, I will pray to ask for God's support so that I remain obedient to His commandment.

CHURCH CONCEPT:

- The church always teaches us to obey.
- The church sets up rites and we need to follow them.
- The church teaches us how to obey our fathers of confession, and our spiritual guides.
- I receive unlimited blessings when I am devoted to fast, pray, read my Bible and obey the church directions.

Bible Verse

In your seed all the nations of the earth shall be blessed, because you have obeyed My voice (Genesis 22:18)



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Passage Reading Genesis 26:12-33



LESSON CONCEPT:

God blesses His children, the peacemakers.

LESSON SUMMARY:

- God provides for Isaac during the time of famine.
- Isaac faces some tribulation with the Palestinians.
- Isaac's encounter with God (Blessing promise), and building an altar.
- Isaac's enemies make peace with him.

- Is God manifested in our relationships with one another in schools, sports, etc.?
- Do I have a prayer corner to meet with Christ daily and have an altar for Him in my house with my family?
- The intercession of Holy Saints in our lives, like Abraham (for the sake of my servant Abraham. Verse 24)



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ISAAC

Passage Reading Genesis 26:12-33

LIFE APPLICATION:

- How can we involve God into our relationships with others?
- How can we establish peace with others (enemies)?
- How can I overcome my fear from others?
- Why did God bless Isaac? And what can we get from God if we love our enemies?
- Love and pray for your friends who are not nice to you.

CHURCH CONCEPT:

- The Church always teaches us to pray for our enemies "Love your enemies" (it is one of the New Testament commandments).
- St Pachomius' life changed because of Christians who brought him food during war.

Bible Verse

You are now the blessed of the Lord (Genesis 26:29)



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Passage Reading Genesis 27



LESSON CONCEPT:

God does not grant blessing and peace to the deceitful.

LESSON SUMMARY:

- Isaac asked Esau his elder son to go for a hunt, prepare a meal and bring it to him to take his blessing.
- Rebekah heard Isaac's request and made Jacob smell and feel like Esau and prepared a meal for Isaac to get the blessing for Jacob instead of Esau.
- Jacob agreed to deceive his father Isaac to take his blessing.
- Esau returned and discovered what happened and was very angry.
- Rebekah asked Jacob to flee to her brother Laban.

- God promised Rebekah to bless Jacob (Genesis 25:23). How could this happen without the deceitful plan that took place?
- Does the end justify the mean? Is it OK to achieve good goals in any possible way?
 (by deception, lying, ...)
- How can I help to restore peace if 2 of my relatives or friends are angry with each other?



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JACOB

Passage Reading Genesis 27

LIFE APPLICATION:

- Do I find some of God's commandments difficult to follow?
- If yes, what should I do?
- If I fall in a sin and feel I have lost my peace, what should I do?
- Should I accept some consequences for a mistake I made? Or should I try to get around it by any means?

CHURCH CONCEPT:

- Be faithful until death, and I will give you the crown of life.
- The saints in our Coptic Church were very faithful, they confessed Jesus' name, and didn't fear anything.
- God rewarded them with the crown of life (the heavenly kingdom)
- We read and learn from their life, honesty and faithfulness.

Bible Verse

For You are not a God who takes pleasure in wickedness, nor shall evil dwell with You (Psalm 5:4)



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Passage Reading Genesis 41:33-57



LESSON CONCEPT:

I trust God who manages everything to the good.

LESSON SUMMARY:

- God gives grace to Joseph in the sight of Pharaoh.
- Joseph is a man filled with the fear and love of God.
- The Holy Spirit, who dwells in us, gives us discernment and wisdom during the time of tribulation.
- God transforms everything for good for those who love and are faithful to Him (Remember, Joseph was only brought out of prison to interpret Pharaoh's dreams).

- Joseph spent years in the prison! Can you imagine what were his thoughts and feelings? (anger, fear, grief..)
- Do you remember a time when God transformed something bad into something good and fruitful in your life?
- Was it a good idea to save (food) in the first 7 years? Do you apply it sometimes in your life/day?
- What would have happened if Joseph didn't go to prison?
- How important is the gift of wisdom in our life?



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JOSEPH

Passage Reading Genesis 41:33-57

LIFE APPLICATION:

- How can we accept the bad things that happen in our life?
- How can we trust that the Lord can transform the bad things into good things?
- How can I get wisdom like Joseph?
- Let's pray every morning to be filled by the Holy Spirit, to have the wisdom and faith to trust in God's plans for our life "O Holy Spirit the Comforter, the Spirit of Truth, Come and dwell in us and purify us" (the litanies of the 3rd hour)

CHURCH CONCEPT:

- The church always teaches us to do the right action even if we look different from others.
- Walk in a straight path even if there are obstacles.
- Pray and trust that the Lord will transform the obstacles for your good.
- Joseph was rejected by his brothers but found grace and favor in the sight of the Lord.

Bible Verse

And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God (Romans 8:28)



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DELIVERANCE

Passage Reading Exodus 3




LESSON CONCEPT:

God feels our troubles and promises to intervene in the correct timing.

LESSON SUMMARY:

- Moses served as a shepherd to his father-in-law's sheep.
- Moses was curious about this fire, so he turned to see it. The Lord spoke to Moses from the bush and told Moses to remove his sandals because he is standing on holy ground.
- God also expressed to Moses that He had seen the affliction of the Israelites in Egypt and He will deliver them from Egypt and bring them to what later became known as the Promised Land.
- God sent a message to the elders of Israel, including instructions of how to stand before pharaoh and free His people.

- God reached out to his people in His right time,
 - » Even if the people of Israel had waited for 400 years and thought God had forgotten about them.
 - » Even if Moses is an old man by then (80 years old).
- 40 years earlier, Moses had the desire to free his people, but he thought he could do it with his hand!
 - » God allowed Moses to have enough time by himself to reflect and grow spiritually before calling him to serve.
 - » God asked Moses to come forward barefoot (i.e. "Don't rely on your power"... "Put your trust in me, and I'll guide you in the way").



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DELIVERANCE

Passage Reading Exodus 3

LIFE APPLICATION:


- Do we need to spend some time alone with God every morning before starting our day?
- Can I go to any place where I'll not have Jesus with me leading me?
- Can I help others to be free and stay in the way of the Lord?
- Whenever you put on your shoes to go out, ask the Lord to lead your life and your day (in school, sports, and everything you do).

CHURCH CONCEPT:

- God reached out to His people in His right time.
- St Moses the Strong spent several years leading a sinful life away from God.
- God reached out to him at the right time, and his life changed completely.
- Trust that the Lord is watching over each one of us and He can change our lives.

Bible Verse

I have surely seen the oppression of My people who are in Egypt, and have heard their cry because of their taskmasters, for I know their sorrows. So I have come down to deliver them out of the hand of the Egyptians (Exodus 3:7, 8)



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THE LAW

Passage Reading Exodus 24




LESSON CONCEPT:

God reveals Himself to those who obey His commandment.

LESSON SUMMARY:

- Moses and the Elders of Israel must come up, rise, worship, and submit sacrifices before they enter an eternal relationship with God on behalf of the people of Israel.
- The blood is essential in our relationship with God (a symbol for the Holy Communion).
- After the people of Israel showed their acceptance of God's word, He revealed Himself to them and they saw the Glory of God on the mountain of Sinai.

- What job/task were the youth (young men) assigned (Exodus 24:5)? What do we offer these days?
- "For this is My blood of the new covenant, which is shed for many for the remission of sins" (Matthew 26:28)
- How do I prepare myself for the Holy Communion?
- What is the sign of my commitment to this covenant with God? (Obedience to His commandment)
- Do I remember my covenant with God every day?

Passage Reading Exodus 24

LIFE APPLICATION:


- Do I need to follow God's commandments?
- What will happen if I didn't follow?
- How can I train myself to be obedient?
- Practice: every morning, I'll include today's verse in my prayer.

CHURCH CONCEPT:

- St John the Short was a good example of obedience.
- We work hard to train ourselves to obey God's word, and commandments.
- Obey the church fathers.
- Obedience is a virtue: we should work hard to live it.

"All that the Lord has said we will do and be obedient." (Exodus 24:7)



THE REBELLION

Passage Reading Numbers 11



LESSON CONCEPT:


God loves to hear our prayers and supplications, but without murmuring.

LESSON SUMMARY:

- The Israelites complain about their situation in the wilderness, and they compare it to their life of slavery in Egypt.
- Their complaining displeases God because He blessed them and whatever they needed He provided.
- They crave the meat and food they used to eat in Egypt and forget that God can provide them with anything they want (who will give us meat to eat?).
- Moses the servant, representing the people of Israel, feels desperate that he couldn't control them.
- God solves the problem and provided the people of Israel with enough meat for everybody.
- Still the people of Israel were greedy and ungrateful, so many of them die from a plague.

- Do you complain during fasting?
- Why does it displease God if His people complain, grumble and rebel?
- Reflect on the covenant with God in the previous lesson and how they should understand that God will provide them with whatever they need only if they follow His ways.
- Is it a sin to crave a special type of food? Why do the church arrange the fasting time for us?

LIFE APPLICATION:


- What should I do when I fast?

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

Passage Reading Numbers 32




LESSON CONCEPT:

There are NO sinners in Heaven, only repentants.

LESSON SUMMARY:

- The Israelites didn't follow the Lord from all their hearts.
- The Lord's anger was aroused against Israel, and He made them wander in the wilderness for forty years.
- None of those who were 20 years old or above will see the promised land.
- Only Caleb, son of Jephunneh, and Joshua, son of Nun, will enter the promised land.
- They would continue wandering until the whole generation who had done evil in the sight of the Lord has gone.

- Do you complain and disobey the Lord all the time?
- Why isn't God pleased when His children don't follow his commandment?
- Is it a sin to disobey God?
- Is it a sin to disobey your leaders?
- Why did God only allow Caleb and Joshua to see the promised land?

- We are devoted to God through the sacraments, Baptism / Confession / Eucharist.
- Be prepared before participating the sacraments.
- Obedience to God, and reconciliation with one another before partaking from Communion.
- Remember that in heaven there are no sinners.

GETTING READY

Passage Reading Joshua 1:10-18



LESSON CONCEPT:

To be ready for Heaven, I must be baptized (cross the Jordan) and live through the power of Christ's resurrection strength (after 3 days).

LESSON SUMMARY:

- Divine provision: Joshua gives orders to the officers to command the people to gather and collect food before crossing the Jordan River within three days (and for us, we must ensure to stock Divine provision by reading and memorizing the Word of God).
- Joshua reminds the Reubenites, the Gadites and half the tribe of Manasseh of their agreement with Moses to cross the Jordan river as well and assist their brothers inherit their lands.
- The men of the two and a half tribes agreed to follow and obeyed Joshua just as they did with Moses.

- How can I get myself prepared for heaven? (we can refer to the parable of the 10 virgins and the oil for the lamps (Matthew 25:1-13)
- The two and a half tribes promised to help their fellow brothers until they inherit their land. What are my obligations toward my family and friends?

GETTING READY

Passage Reading Joshua 1:10-18

LIFE APPLICATION:

- What should I do to be prepared for eternal life?
- What happens if someone is not baptized?
- How can I live Christianity?
- I will live rejoicing because I know that I am supported by the resurrected Lord, and I know I have a place in heaven

CHURCH CONCEPT:

- The first step to live Christian life and be ready is to get baptized.
- Baptism is one of the 7 sacraments in our church.
- Through Baptism we are born again, by being immersed in water 3 times.
- Baptism is the door by which the believers enter the church and partake in the rest of the sacraments.

Bible Verse

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

To inherit Jericho (Heaven), the (Ego) wall must fall. Also, I should not underestimate Ai (the sins that appear to be minimal).

LESSON SUMMARY:

- One member's sin was considered a sin of the whole body.
- The spies underestimated Ai, "they are few".
- The children of Israel fled before the men of Ai.
- Joshua interceded and prayed for the people.
- God revealed that due to Israel's sin, they lost "God's blessings and protection" (verse 12: Neither will I be with you anymore)
- The solution: stop the Sin + Sanctification (verse 12,13: unless you destroy the accursed from among you, get up, sanctify the people, and say, 'Sanctify yourselves for tomorrow')

- Can one sin (or something wrong) that someone committed affect others? (their family, friends, club... e.g. losing World Cup)
- What do you do when a friend boasts about something wrong they did? (Do you laugh together about it? Do you reasonably highlight the correct Christian action?)
- Do we sometimes underestimate "small sins"? What could happen if we keep repeating them? (may convert to be a habit and bring other sins)
- What do we do if we sin? (repentance + getting sanctified by the Holy Communion)

- Since the days of Joshua, God commanded His people not to live with the gentiles, who were the original inhabitants of Canaan, but rather drive them out. However, the Israelites did not listen to God's commandment and lived with those nations.
- SIN: As a result of living with the Gentiles, the Israelites started mingling with them, marrying their daughters and sons, and even serving their gods, the idols.
- Because of their sin, they started suffering from Cushan for 8 years.
- The children of Israel cried out to the Lord.
- God sent Othniel (his name means God's strength and response) to save the people of God.
- The land rested for 40 years until Othniel's death.

- Why did God refuse those nations while accepting Rahab to join the people of God? (Rahab believed in God and followed His commandments and became one of the Israelites leaving behind her old life. On the other hand, those nations remained worshiping the idols and living in their sins).


LESSON CONCEPT:

LESSON SUMMARY:

- This chapter explains the sin consequences through prophecies. The prophet's shaved hair is divided into portions as a symbol (Ezekiel 5:1-4) showing God's judgment upon Jerusalem (verses 5-11), by pestilence, by famine, by the sword, and by dispersion.
- God would accomplish His purpose of teaching the nations through Israel. If they had obeyed the covenant, He would have taught them through the blessings given (as in the days of Solomon). For the covenant breakers, God would teach the nations through His judgment upon His people.

- How can we listen to God's voice?
- If we hear His voice, will we obey or ignore it?
- What had happened to the Israelites when they ignored God's voice?


LESSON CONCEPT:


LESSON CONCEPT:

- Joseph receives direction from God, through an angel, in a dream. He must take Jesus and Mary and go to Egypt to escape Herod's plan to kill the child Jesus.
- They leave that night, settling for a time in Egyptian territory, waiting to be called back by the angel when Herod has died.
- Herod realizes the wise men have left the area without telling him where the Christ child is. He sends men to kill all male babies in Bethlehem, two years old and younger.
- After Herod dies, Joseph has two more dreams. First, the
 angel tells him it is safe to return to Israel because those who
 wanted to kill Jesus are dead. When Joseph gets to Israel, he
 is concerned about the cruel and unpredictable son of Herod
 who now reigns over Judea. Through another dream, God
 sends Joseph and Mary to their hometown of Nazareth in
 the region of Galilee.

- How can I serve the Lord?
- By obeying His commandment (St Joseph)
- How did St Joseph humble himself before the Lord? Can Jesus be my friend?
- St Joseph was always obedient; he always heard God's voice and obeyed God's commandments.
- How was the prophecy (He shall be called "Nazarene") fulfilled?





- Did the wise men risk their lives for the sake of Jesus?
 - » They took the risk of travel (unsafe), they offered precious gifts for a new king in a place they don't know about!

LESSON CONCEPT:

As a true Christian and son of God, I believe that God the Almighty is always in control.

LESSON SUMMARY:

- When St Paul and Silas started to preach, a certain woman named Lydia heard them. The Lord opened her heart to believe.
- Her entire household accepted Christ as Savior, and they were baptized. Lydia invited Paul and Silas to stay in her home (Acts 16:15).
- Her house became the meeting place of the first European church.
- When Paul and Silas were thrown into a Philippian prison, Lydia visited them and attended to their needs.
- Paul & Silas in prison:
 - » They prayed and praised God in all situations "at midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God" (16:25)
 - » True believers are a light in darkness. Even if you don't preach, others will notice "the prisoners were listening to them".
 - » They didn't run away and had influence on others "Do yourself no harm, for we are all here." (16:28)
- The Philippian jailer was saved:
 - » "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" (16:30)
 - » Actions aligned with our faith are better than a thousand words.

- Can you preach without talking? How can we glow in our community (school, neighborhood, team, etc.)? (Pray for them, always be a good example, put your money where your mouth is...)
- Paul was able to influence tens of prisoners, and they did the right thing and didn't run away. Who are your main influencers? Are you inspired to do good things by following them? Like what?
- Why did Paul insist not to leave the prison without a formal apology?
 (Seeking justice and my rights doesn't contradict with being humble or accepting tribulations for the name of Christ)

- Paul fled to Athens where the Epicurean and Stoic philosophers did not accept his argument.
- They took him to Areopagus, wondering about the new doctrine that he taught.
- He quoted Greek poets to introduce God as the creator of the world, through the altar with the inscription "TO THE UNKNOWN GOD".
- Then, in wisdom, he started to talk about Jesus Christ and the resurrection.

- Was St Paul wise to initiate his preaching using the unknown God for the Athenians?
- What can we do with the people who don't know about God?
- Is it okay to introduce God to unbelievers?

LESSON CONCEPT:

If I use my talents to win others to Christ, I am a true son/daughter for my heavenly Father.

LESSON SUMMARY:

- The kingdom of heaven is like three servants of a wealthy master. Each was given resources—the master's assets—and commanded to do business with them while the master went away. Two of the servants use the supplied funds and double the sum of money that the master leaves with them.
- The third servant merely preserves the treasure given to him.
- Because he was afraid of who he imagined the Master would be, he did not explore what he could do with his talent. He did not even think of his talent.

LESSON SUMMARY:

- What talents do I have? How can I use them properly?
- Do I have to use them? Or should I keep them like the third servant?
- How can I prepare myself for heaven by using my talents? (being faithful)

- Jesus concludes His letter to the church at Pergamos by extending an invitation and making a promise.
 He invites anyone with ears to hear the Spirit's messages to the churches.

- What are the problem(s) of this church?
- What is the treatment?
- What is the heavenly reward for those who conquer (these problems)?

LIFE APPLICATION:

- How can I live a true Christian life in the world? Am I ready to stand against heresies?
- What are modern days heresies? How can I defend my faith against these heresies?

CHURCH CONCEPT:

- Defending the Christian faith started a long time ago in our church. Young kids were able to stand against great kings to defend their faith (St Abanoub).
- St Athanasius stood against the whole world to defend the faith against the heresy of Arius.
- He saw Arius as a heretic, not a brother in Christ. To accept him would be to accept false doctrine.

Bible Verse

"To him who overcomes I will give some of the hidden manna to eat. And I will give him a white stone, and on the stone a new name written which no one knows except him who receives it" (Revelation 2:17)
